

Exodus 20:15

Ahab (AY-hab) Ahab was a selfish Bible-time king. Ahab always wanted more things.

Jezebel (JEZ-uh-bel) Jezebel was <u>Ahab's</u> wife. Jezebel did not worship God. Jezebel wanted to have more and more things too.





Naboth (NAY-bahth) <u>Naboth</u> had a vineyard. King Ahab wanted <u>Naboth's vineyard</u>.

vineyard

A <u>vineyard</u> is a field where grapes grow on vines. Vines are small branches. <u>Naboth</u> grew grapes in a <u>vineyard</u>.

God's commandments:

- (A) "You shall not murder." Exodus 20:13
- B "You shall not steal." Exodus 20:15
- © "You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor." Exodus 20:16
- D "You shall not covet." Exodus 20:17



Directions: Read the commandments and point out the letters beside them. Explain that four of the children in the pictures are not obeying the commandments. Students are to find those four children and put in the circle beside them the letters of the commandments they are not obeying. They may leave the other circles blank. Discuss each commandment.

Directions: Help students read the words below each picture.
