At This Age

As your child grows, one way to help build confidence is to give opportunities to make decisions. Even two year olds can be encouraged to make decisions. Some things to keep in mind while teaching your young child about decisions are:

• Give your child only two things to choose between. For example, "Would you like a banana or an apple?"

• Give your child a choice only when you are willing to accept the decision.

• Always follow through when a child makes a decision.
